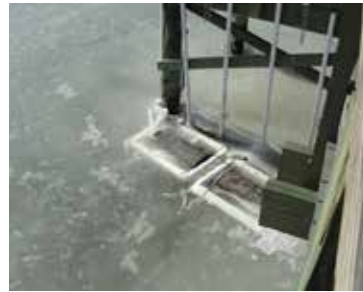

## OUR NEW OYSTERQUARIUM IS A GO!

The new OYSTERQUARIUM on the trail is a live interpretative demonstration of the oyster cycle from larvae to adults. This project is located at the first rest stop. It contains a large tank for the oysters as well as graphics showing the many benefits of the oysters and the CBOCS yearly activities. who volunteered on the project include members of CBOCS, Northern High School Lorax Club, The Town of Chesapeake Beach Public Works Department, Citizen Volunteers and TNT Signs and Graphics.

Also newly created is the "South Side Walking Tour," that starts at the Railway Museum and is a self-guided tour that will give you insight as to what the amusement park and other features of the Town looked like decades ago. Local artist Clarence "Shoe" Schumaker did the layout work, and many others were instrumental in the research and development of this tour including Staff from the Chesapeake Beach Railway Museum, Twin Beaches Library Branch Manager Joanie Kilmon and many citizen volunteers.

I would once again encourage you to take advantage of the "Mayor's Night Out" program. At 7:30 p.m. on the first Monday of each month, we have an informal gathering in the Council Chambers. Recently, we've had presentations on the Water Park, the Special Operations Team of the Sheriff's Department, the Fishing Creek Bridge Replacement project,

and the previously mentioned "South Side Walking Tour." In April, we'll be looking at a newly proposed GIS (Geographic Information System) for the Town. In May, Jay Berry will demonstrate the Town's SCADA (Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition) system that we employ to operate our sewer collection system and our water system. And I am always open to ideas that are of interest at each meeting.

## Parking Restrictions on Town Streets

**Except to avoid conflict with other traffic or to obey a police officer or traffic control device there is No Stopping, Standing or Parking on Town Streets, when:**

**In front of or blocking access to:**  
A public driveway, alley a mailbox, a private driveway or access to private property

**In or On:**  
An Intersection, sidewalk, crosswalk, bridge

**Alongside of or opposite any street excavation if the parking would block traffic**

**Double Parking**

**There is an official sign or painted curb prohibiting stopping**

**Within:**  
15 feet of a hydrant  
20 feet of the entrance to the Fire Department or an intersection not controlled by a Stop Sign or other traffic control device  
30 feet of a flushing signal, stop sign or traffic control device

**None of the following types of vehicles are allowed to park in excess of 1 hour Town Streets:**

**Vehicle requiring a CDL License, RV, Camper, Trailer for boats, Vehicles or Recreations Equipment**

**A vehicle having a cover that must be removed to operate**

**Vehicles with expired or no tags, vehicles which are missing one or more components which make that vehicle to be moved under its own power are Not Allowed in town, unless out of public view**
